


A Word from the Directors

Little Shop of Horrors was the first of several successful collaborations of Howard Ashman and Alan Menken. It opened off-Broadway in 1982, and was a huge commercial success, with the original production running for over five years. It was made into a hit movie, starring Rick Moranis, Ellen Greene (who was the original Audrey), and Steve Martin. The show has gone on to be produced consistently worldwide, including at Pascack Valley in 1993.

One of the things that makes *Little Shop of Horrors* stand out as a musical title are the absurd and dark questions that confront our hero, Seymour, after he introduces Audrey 2 to Mr. Mushnik's plant shop. Seymour and his fellow inhabitants of Skid Row are all trying to escape their current reality, and as the show progresses, each of them has to ask the question: "How far are you willing to go to get ahead in life?"

The concept of "how far are you willing to go" is something that everyone who has worked on this production of *Little Shop of Horrors* has had to consider this year. How far were we willing to go to create a musical during COVID? We were willing to learn almost all of our music and choreography remotely. We were willing to record the entire score in small, dark recording booths constructed by our diligent crew. We were willing to coordinate costume and prop deliveries to individual homes while holding all team meetings remotely. We were willing to lip-sync along with the recordings while filming on individual phones in our homes. We were willing to create elaborate storyboards for where/how the individual 'tiles' of each actor should appear and move on screen. We were willing to spend hundreds of hours recording instruments, editing vocals, and mixing tracks to produce the music you hear tonight.

Throughout it all, we have missed the spirit and fun of creating live theatre, but have been a part of a powerful learning experience. Thank you to the amazing students who were a part of this process for giving so much to our work during this strange time.

Please enjoy how far we were willing to go to create this performance, and we hope you will join us again in the Joseph Poli Auditorium when live performances resume next year. Until then, be safe and be well.

Howard Ashman (Book and Lyrics) Mr. Ashman's first love was theater; he was a founder of Off-Off-Broadway's renowned WPA Theatre, where he conceived, wrote, and directed God Bless You, Mr. Rosewater, as well as the classic musical Little Shop of Horrors (both with music by Alan Menken). In 1986 he wrote and directed the Broadway musical Smile (music by Marvin Hamlisch). Lamented as a lost treasure of the 1980s theater scene, Smile remains popular on high school and college campuses throughout the country. Howard Sings Ashman, a compilation of Mr. Ashman's recorded demos, is available from PS Classics. In his short career, he received many awards, including The Outer Circle Critics Award, New York Drama Critics Circle and Drama Desk (Little Shop), two Oscars (Mermaid and Beauty), two Golden Globes (Mermaid and Beauty) and multiple Grammys. His papers are in the permanent collection of the Library of Congress. Howard, a documentary about his life, was produced in 2018. Mr. Ashman died in 1991 of complications of AIDS. www.howardashman.com

Alan Menken (Music) Legendary composer Alan Menken has created some of the most beloved songs and musical scores of our time, with his unique voice as a composer capturing the imagination of audiences for over 35 years. Known for his music on stage and screen, he is noted for his multiple works with the Walt Disney Company (The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast, Aladdin), as well as Broadway stage musicals Sister Act and Little Shop of Horrors. With eight Academy Awards, Alan has received more Oscars than any living person, and is the recipient of numerous other awards including Golden Globes, Grammys, Drama Desk Awards, and a Tony Award.
