A word from the directors...

Footloose. When we first came to the ealization that this movie-turned-rock musical was the ideal choice for this year's musical, we were less than enthusiastic. We knew that it was the ideal choice for our current troupe of players because it offered a contrast to our past several musicals, provided an opportunity for our entire company to enhance their dance abilities, had a number of featured roles that exhibited many students' musical and acting skills, and boasted a pop/rock score that is a blast to sing. However, the original Broadway adaptation was not well received, and the show is widely regarded as sub-par by some in the professional theatre community. Thankfully, a show that began with mixed emotions has grown on us — and we feel foolish (for allowing past perceptions to color our experience) and thankful (for the opportunity to create this fantastic show). Note to self: Never allow past opinion to spoil your present reality. Such is PV Theatre's Footloose.

As we have worked on this show over the past several months, some basic themes have come to the forefront, and we caught ourselves falling in love with the people and the story that lie at the heart of this show. Footloose is not a jukebox musical with a simplistic plot, or a flimsy sto yline strung between rock anthems. There is a powerful story to connect to: a tale of people having their beliefs challenged and coping with change, loneliness and frustration.

Many of us could identify with Ren & Ethel who were transplanted into a new, strange situation with different rules and an insular community 'code' to crack. The idea of being (or feeling like you are) "different" is not unusual to any of us. There are moments in each of our lives when we can identify with the themes of loss, gossip, and xenophobia that are at the core of this show. The characters on the stage may not feel familiar — they don't share our social or cultural landscape, but their stories of survival, coping, and adjustment play out with the same honesty and heart.

Often, the conservative values presented by the residents of Bomont are upheld as righteous, but that is simply a mask — they stem from deep-seated insecurity and fear. Ren and Shaw play out those feelings on our stage, but in the end, acceptance triumphs — and a new future is created. May our futures all look so bright.
