### A Word from the Directors...

For months, we have all been trying to figure out how to hold on to the things that we're used to, that bring us comfort and cheer and a sense of the familiar, in circumstances that are working against us. The times we're living through are not familiar; so much is strange and new. Cheer and comfort are sometimes in short supply. For those of us who love seeing and creating live theatre, there has been a profound sense of loss. We have no idea when — or if — things will be as they once were for us. All we know is that, for the foreseeable future, we simply cannot (safely, responsibly) do what we have always done.

Hours upon hours of video formatting and editing to put the finishing touches on what you're about to see.

When we began, we didn't know what any of this would be like. What a comfort it was to have familiar stories at the heart of our work, to play with and make discoveries about! How it cheered us to discover that we could still work and joke and learn like we always have! The faces, the frustrations, and the fun all were, or quickly became, familiar.

And so we now find ourselves exactly where we always are at this point in the process of putting on a PV Theatre show. Proud beyond words of our students' work. Amazed at their passion, energy, creativity, and fortitude. Indebted to our incredible PV Theatre alumni collaborators, without whom none of this would have been possible. Grateful to be able to make art with young people, and grateful to you for coming to see it. Thank you all.

Until we see you again in person, we will continue to create and connect virtually. Be safe. Be well.
