

A Word from the Directors...

We believe strongly in the power of storytelling. We strive to give the students and audiences of PV Theatre a varied experience of stories told onstage, in terms of style and content and thematic substance. But every story we've brought to life here over the past 11 years has had one thing in common – they've all been someone else's. WIth *Brainstorm*, for the first time, the students of PV Theatre are telling their own stories.

The structure of the play and its scientific content was provided by Company Three, the British community theatre for young people who created the first version of it. The published script, based on the 2015 performances of *Brainstorm* at Park Theatre and the National Theatre in London, gave us the framework upon which to build our version. All the personal content comes from our PV students and the work they have been doing since early September.

Devised theatre – theatre created by the company performing it – is a new genre for us here. Instead of the rehearsal process being focused on memorizing lines and staging, the company spends a great deal of time generating content. We have played games, done writing exercises, improvised, made and shared videos, scripted and workshopped scenes, and talked with each other. A lot. As is usually the case in a devising process, all the work was centered around a central concept. In this case, that concept is what recent advances in brain science have revealed about the unique nature of the teenage mind.

It is often said, among proponents of educational theatre, that the process of creating a devised piece is as valuable, if not moreso than, the final product. At the recommendation of the original creators, we set three rules for our work: be kind, be brave, be yourself. We are so grateful for the honest, open participation of each of the 41 actors in this show, who have opened a window into their hearts, minds, and lives to each other in this process. In marrying the science and their stories throughout their process, they've gained an enriched understanding of themselves and each other.

The importance of the product, though, can't be overlooked. They have done all this work, and are sharing their stories, for you. Their audience. They have things to show you and stories to tell you. Their stories. As educators, we have noticed a shift in how we view and understand our students because of this show. We wish the same for you. One of the great gifts theatre can give to the world is increased understanding of one another, and our world could sure use that right now.


